Navy Yacht Club San Diego will host the South Bay Combined Series Navy Cup Race Saturday, July 20, 2019.

This Regatta promises to be exciting as it's the second of three races by which to qualify for the South Bay Combined Championship to be held this fall.

Happy Summer NYCS D! The Navy Cup Regatta is rapidly approaching – July 20th!

As you all know, the club was founded in 1964 on the shores of Glorietta Bay in Coronado. In 1967, the club moved to its present location at Fiddler's Cove. That was the first year of the Navy Cup, then held in October.

By 1969, Southwestern and Mission Bay Yacht Club split honors in the Navy Cup, sailing in the Olympic class boats, the Soling and Flying Dutchman. In 1973, NYCS D, then known as the San Diego Naval Sailing Club (SDNSC), hosted the Flying Dutchman National Championships for a week in July, with 30 to 40 boats competing.

In 1976, over the course of two days, the Navy Cup hosted 47 boats with the Catalina 27s comprising the largest fleet. While the number of competing boats has shrunk over the years, it's still the same great wind, same sunny climate and same competitive spirit that makes this a classy San Diego day on the water!

Not only is the Navy Cup a great race in the most wide-open and traffic-free part of San Diego Bay, but the post-race dining is also our members' Summertime Beach Bash. All members are invited to come down to the patio for an Italian-themed cuisine.

Reservations can be made on www.nycsd.club or when registering your sailboat to race on Regatta Network, www.nycsd.club on the "Racing" page. Tickets are \$20 per person and \$10 for children under 10. Reservations close Friday COB and unfortunately, no tickets will be sold on the day of the event.

- 1255 David Ray and his mother Betty on Pie in the Sky (Krogan 37) moor to port side to R Gang.
- 1350 Set Pie in the Sky stern anchor.

- 1210 Rob Fowler of No Worries (Catalina 34) moors to the port side of Pie in the Sky.
- 1230 Candace Redcliffe with Joy and Dwight on Woosah (Catalina 34) moors to the port side of No Worries.

- 1350 Set Liberte's bow anchor for security with this many boats.
