Greetings Navy Yacht Club!

As this year's summer comes to a close, it does not mean the fun is over. Here in San Diego we are blessed to have a year round boating season. As things do slow down the real fun starts. It is time to think about our boats and all the things that need to be done to keep her afloat and operating properly. This is a good time to check all your safety equipment. Look at your life jackets, if auto inflatable, when was the last time the CO2 was changed? Pull out all the spare life jackets to see if they are in good condition. How is the motor doing after a long summers use? It may be time to change the oil and replace the impellers. Check the engine belts, hoses, and wiring connections. Give your boat a good inspection, looking for loose or damaged life lines and rigging. Verify all the bilge pumps are operating properly. How about the CO2, smoke, or bilge alarms... are they still functioning properly? Is it time to grease the anchor windless? Inspect the rode for any signs of wear. Sound your ships whistle and turn on the navigation lights; does everything work like it should? While you are at it, don't forget about the dingy and generator if you have them.
